Scripture:

Ice Breaker and Intro Question:

1. Is there a topic where disagreement or argument tends to pull you in? (For example: politics, sports, The Bachelorette, etc.)
2. What resonated with you from Sunday's service? (Sermon, scripture, song, etc.)

Discussion Questions

3. Read Philippians 3:20 together as a group. How does this perspective affect our everyday life? Is there an area of your life where you especially need this reminder?
4. Read Colossians 4:5-6 quietly on your own. Have everyone take a moment to jot down some wisdom that comes from this passage. What stands out to you? How should we let this passage shape our lives in the coming weeks?
5. Read Matthew 7:3-5 together as a group. Why is it easier to give ourselves slack and grace that we aren't willing to extend to others?
6. Chip encouraged us to acknowledge that people are complex. Why is it easier sometimes to see people as totally good or totally evil, rather than more complicated (as we understand ourselves to be)? What does it look like in 2020 to wrestle with Jesus' command to "love your enemies?"
7. Get practical. What do you sense Jesus saying to you today through his word? Take some time to pray for one another – specifically based on what you share.
