Scripture:

"About that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven?"

² Jesus called a little child to him and put the child among them. ³ Then he said, "I tell you the truth, unless you turn from your sins and become like little children, you will never get into the Kingdom of Heaven. ⁴ So anyone who becomes as humble as this little child is the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven.

⁵ "And anyone who welcomes a little child like this on my behalf^[a] is welcoming me. ⁶ But if you cause one of these little ones who trusts in me to fall into sin, it would be better for you to have a large millstone tied around your neck and be drowned in the depths of the sea

Reflection Questions:

- When have you felt the most carefree and childlike? Why?
- What is a characteristic that you admire in kids?
- Read Matthew 18:1-6, 10 slowly. Read it again, but from a different translation (use biblegateway.com if you need access to the NLT, Message paraphrase, NASB, NKJV). What words or phrases stand out to you?
- Chris shared, "Growing up in our relationship with God means growing into increasing dependence on God." Have you experienced this? Share what this looked like for you.

- In Sunday's message, Chris shared three things that prevent us from depending on God:
 - We don't depend on God because we don't want to ask for help.
 - We don't depend on God because have grown comfortable.
 - We don't depend on God because we're worried about what others will think.

Which of these do you struggle with? Why is that?

- Kids are in constant conversation with the ones they love. Read Matthew 6:11. Use this simple prayer from Jesus to start an honest, childlike conversation between you and God. Write it out or say it out loud.
- What's one way this week that you can be more childlike in your connection to God? Draw a picture or write some phrases about what it might look like.
- What is God calling you to do in response to Jesus' teaching and this message? Who can you share with this week about this?
