## Scripture:

"Be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Matthew 28:20

Remember, when you are being tempted, do not say, "God is tempting me." God is never tempted to do wrong, and he never tempts anyone else. Temptation comes from our own desires, which entice us and drag us away.

James 1:13-14

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted there by the devil. <sup>2</sup> For forty days and forty nights he fasted and became very hungry.

<sup>3</sup> During that time the devil came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become loaves of bread."

'People do not live by bread alone,

but by every word that comes from the mouth of God."

<sup>5</sup> Then the devil took him to the holy city, Jerusalem, to the highest point of the Temple, <sup>6</sup> and said, "If you are the Son of God, jump off! For the Scriptures say,

'He will order his angels to protect you.

And they will hold you up with their hands

so you won't even hurt your foot on a stone."

'You must worship the Lord your God

and serve only him."

## Reflection Questions:

- Do you have someone that you've ever called your "ride or die?"
- What stood out to you from Sunday's service? How did you sense God at work in you through the songs, the message, and being together with others as part of the church?
- Read Matthew 28:20. How does this promise from Jesus affect you? Have you experienced God's presence with you? How?
- In his message, Eddie took some time to define a few words: "sin" and "temptation." How would you explain the meaning of those words in your own words?
- Read this quote from the movie, The Usual Suspects. "The greatest trick the devil ever pulled is convincing the world he
  doesn't exist." Do you agree? Why?
- Read about Jesus' temptation in Matthew 4:1-11. Read it in several translations. If you're with others, take turns reading it
  out loud.
- What stands out to you about Jesus in this story? What do you notice about Satan?
- Eddie shared that "not every temptation is evil on its face...sometimes temptation is not only about WHAT, it's about WHY and HOW and WHEN." What are some examples that come to mind when you hear that?
- There are three takeaways from Jesus' temptation that Eddie shared:
  - o rather than test your capacity, trust God's resources
  - o rather than test God's patience, trust God's timing
  - o rather than test God's grace, trust God's commands

Which one do you need to hold onto this week?
