When the religious elites questioned his legitimacy, rather than trying to win their favor, Jesus said, "The tax collectors and the prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you."

In a polarized culture where cut-throat religion and politics were not metaphors, Jesus said, "You've been told to love your neighbor and hate vour enemy. I tell vou to love vour enemies. Do good to those who hate you."

As followers of Jesus, I hope everyone connected to West Side will be an extension of the sometimes enigmatic nature of Jesus. May we be... filled with grace and filled with truth, like Jesus... friends with the godly and friends with sinners, like Jesus... devoted to our church and engaged with our community, like Jesus.

Spencer and Jessica Phillips were invited to West Side by a friend in early 2016. When they walked through the doors, Jessica shared that they immediately felt at home. The Phillips were married last May and have been passionately pursuing God as a blended family ever since.

"Having a blended family comes with specific challenges," Spencer and Jessica remarked. "We've always hoped that God would blend our families together and help us feel like one family."

"When I first started coming to church," Spencer explained, "I was struggling with depression and a lot of anger. I felt like life was just beating me up. West Side has given me hope and helped me turn my life around.

I've found a new passion for both God and family. On Sundays when I go to church and on Wednesdays when we connect with our groups, I feel like I'm part of something bigger again."

Jessica's life has also changed in a significant way. "Before coming to West Side, I was lost. I was sad and an emotional rollercoaster. Coming to West Side has helped me turn around, emotionally. My faith has given me hope that there are better days ahead. Give God everything you have and he'll take care of you."

We started tithing and one thing after another started turning around in our lives."

Spencer reflects, "The thought of being able to get rid of my past, start fresh and do the things God wants us to do is awesome! I can tell God is not only working in us, but in our kids' lives as well."



Those are words I had not heard before in my life! It was then that I realized that West Side truly was a church for everyone.
